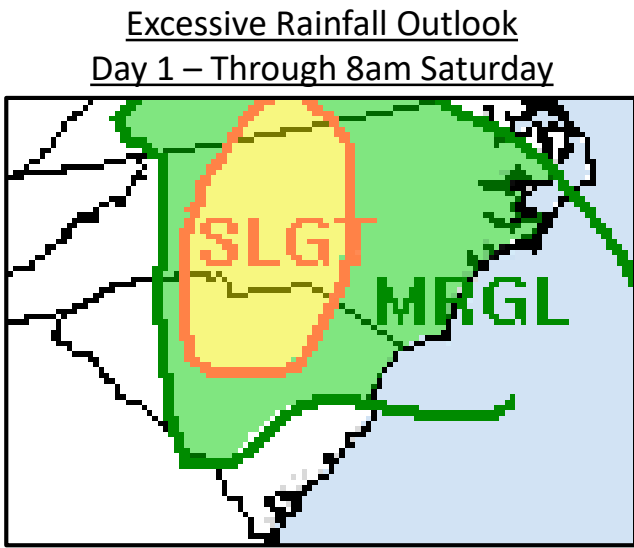
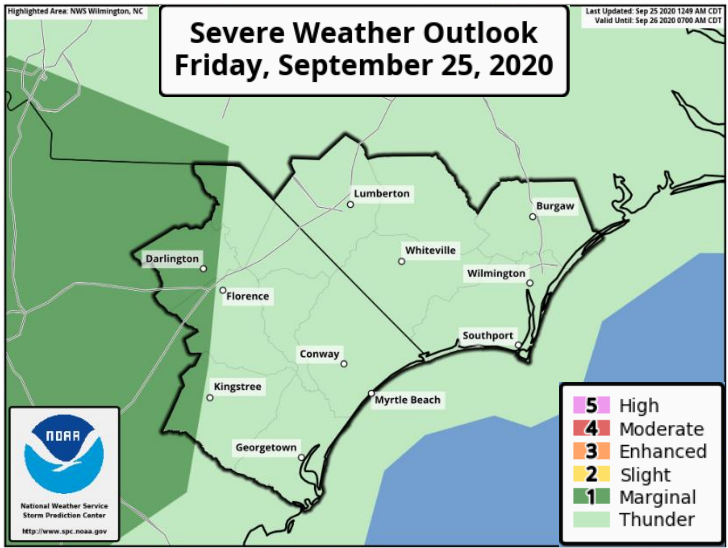

Remnants of Beta to Bring Increased Rain Through Saturday Morning

Overview: Remnants of Post-Tropical Cyclone Beta move through the area today through Saturday morning, bringing occasional heavy rain and low end severe threat. Above normal temperatures to follow this weekend, with a drying trend Saturday and scattered afternoon storms possible Sunday.

- Around 0.5” rainfall expected through Saturday morning, with locally higher amounts in convection.
 - Slight risk of excessive rainfall for Darlington and Marlboro counties, with Marginal risk rest of NE SC and SE NC.
 - Heaviest rain will be this afternoon and evening for Pee Dee region and overnight hours for Cape Fear Region.
- Marginal risk for severe weather for the NW Pee Region – isolated strong winds possible with a non-zero tornado threat.
 - Main threat window will be this afternoon through early evening.
- Flooding possible Lower Cape Fear River at Downtown ILM with this evening’s high tide. Will get close to flooding with each evening high tide this weekend.
- Moderate rip current risk Pender and New Hanover counties today.



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
